

EXIT WRITING PORTFOLIO OVERVIEW

Purpose

The writing portfolio is an opportunity for you to present the work you've written and revised in English 101 and to demonstrate that you have achieved a level of writing competency required of students entering English 201.

Materials

- One manila folder (available in the bookstore for 10 cents)

Documents

When assembling your portfolio, organize your documents in the following order from top (1) to bottom (7):

1. The portfolio checklist
2. The reflection paper prompt
3. Your reflection paper
4. The prompt for your Autobiographical Essay
5. All drafts of your Autobiographical Essay
6. The prompt for parts one and two of your argument/persuasion essay
7. All drafts of your argument/persuasion paper

Note: You may only submit extensively revised material in your portfolio. If you have not extensively revised your two major essays, you will automatically fail the portfolio and English 101.

Grade & Evaluation

The portfolio will be worth no less than 51% of your grade. Here is a standard grade distribution:

- Portfolio: 65%
- Essay Exam: 10%
- Draft, Autobiographical Essay: 10%
- Draft, Persuasive Essay: 10%
- Assignments: 5%
